2012 RALLY FOR LIFE AND MEMORIAL WALK - On Sunday, January 22, from 2:30 to 3:30 at Pioneer Courthouse Square, the lives of 54 million children lost to abortion will be remembered. Our nation and its leaders will be called upon to give unborn children the protection they deserve.

Young Samuel is acutely sensitive to the voice that calls him in the temple. As soon as the living God pronounces his name, the child awakens, attentive to the Presence. Through the instruction of Eli, he is open to recognize and to name the One who speaks. Something similar happens the first time Jesus meets some of his future disciples. Jesus is walking on the banks of the Jordan. On the testimony of the Baptist who points him out, two men begin to look for him, attentive to his word, "Come and see." There is no constraint. Jesus invites them to walk freely toward the truth.

Of the two disciples who follow Jesus, only Andrew is named. We are left to guess that the other is the beloved disciple. But behind his anonymity he is each of us, called in the same way to recognize the Lord.
